1. State and National Standards:

2. Essential questions:

- i. Why is rhythm needed to create music?
- ii. How do I produce a characteristic tone quality?

3. Student learning outcomes (SLO):

- i. Students will demonstrate the ability to produce a characteristic ukulele tone.
- ii. Students will be able to switch be the C and F Major chords with music.

4. Prior knowledge:

- i. Students will be familiar with the basics of the ukulele.
- ii. Students will be familiar with switching between the C and F Major chords.

5. Materials needed:

i. Ukuleles per student

6. Organization:

- i. This class will be taught entirely in full group organization.
- ii. Music class will last for 45 minutes per 2nd Grade class.

TEACHING PROCEDURES

A. Introduction:

- i. Students should enter the classroom and go to their chairs
- ii. If they have their iPads with them, they should put them underneath their chairs

B. Groundwork: Ukulele Review

- i. Students should enter the back room as instructed to acquire a ukulele.
- ii. Once students grab a ukulele, they should sit with the instrument in lap position.
- iii. After all students have a ukulele, check to make sure that students have their ukuleles in the correct position and direction.
- iv. Run through the spot check before beginning to play

- 1. Address any ukulele issues as necessary.
- C. Engagement: C Major Chord / F Major Chord
 - i. Review the labelling and numbering of:
 - 1. Fingers
 - 2. Frets
 - 3. Strings
 - ii. Review C Major Chord and F Major Chord
 - iii. Perform with "Don't Worry Be Happy"
 - 1. Repeat multiple times if needed
 - 2. Accompany with piano, guitar, Ubass, etc.
 - iv. For extra time, use:
 - 1. Drum Circle Activities
 - 2. Second Grade Songs
- D. Assessment:
 - i. Mr. Behler will be available to help students individually with the C Major chord, F Major chord, and general ukulele technique.
- E. Closure and summarizing strategy:
 - i. Ukulele return procedures
- F. Assignments or practice requirements:
 - i. None

Differentiation

Early finishers: This class will be run in full group organization; there won't be early finishers. Remediation: Students can use simplified means to find the C Major chord as necessary. Enrichment: Students can focus on the tone of their ukulele strumming. Students can also begin to find other chords if they feel entirely confident and demonstrate fluency with C Major. Special Accommodations: If students have any motor control issues when playing the ukuleles, they can simplify the execution of techniques.
